Sunday Barbecue Pursuit Race Series

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Rules: The Wednesday evening races will be governed by the International Sailing Federation Racing Rules and the US Sailing Association's *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-2012* (here after referred to as 2009-2012 Racing Rules), except as altered by this document, the *NCYC 2010 Sunday Barbecue Pursuit Race Series Sailing Instructions* and the *NCYC 2010 Sunday Barbecue Pursuit Race Series Notice of Races* and any other sailing instructions and safety requirements that apply.

Notices to Competitors: Notices to competitors will be posted on the official regatta notice board located in *North Cape Yacht Club* between the Men's and Women's restrooms, the windows adjacent to the front entrance of the club and available on the NCYC web site. **PLEASE NOTE:** that these locations will have the **Listing of Starting Times** for all entrants for each race. **PLEASE FURTHER NOTE:** that **the Listing of Starting Times for entrants will vary from race to race** and must be consulted prior to the race.

Changes to the Sailing Instructions: Any changes to the sailing instructions will be posted no later than one hour before the affected race.

Signals Made Ashore: Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flag staff between the *NCYC* Clubhouse and the channel. **Postponement** is indicated by Code Flag "AP" accompanied by two sound signals. The warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after the "AP" flag is lowered. **Abandonment** is indicated by Code Flag "N" and three sound signals.

Race Schedule and Scoring: See Notice of Race.

Marks: The five *NCYC* permanent marks are arranged in a diamond pattern approximately two miles on a side with a center mark near the center. Each mark is painted orange and may display an identifying letter "W" (West), "N" (North), "E" (East), "S" (South) and "C" (Center).

The Course: The Race Committee will identify the course for each race by displaying the appropriate course direction number prior to the warning signal. The course number will be indicated either by panels with black numbers on a white background or by signal flags 1 (one) through 9 (nine).

The Start: Races will be started in accordance with the 2009– 2012 Racing Rules, Rule 26. The starting line will be located between an orange flag on the R/C boat and the closest mark.

The starting order and class flag color will be as follows:

Start order

Will be as indicated on the List of Starting Times as displayed at locations indicated above in Notices to Competitors.

Finish: All finishes will be at the **WEST** mark unless shortened in accordance with instructions listed below and the 2009-2012 Racing Rules, rule 32.

Postponement: Code Flag "AP" and two sound signals. The Warning Signal will be made one minute after lowering the "AP" flag.

Recalls: **INDIVIDUAL RECALL** (one or more yachts) is signaled by Code Flag "X" and one sound signal.

Shortening Course: Code Flag "S" and two sound signals.

Abandonment of Race: Code Flag "N" and three sound signals.

The Finish: All finishes will be at the WEST mark unless shortened in accordance with instructions listed below and the 2009-2012 Racing Rules, rule 32. The finish line will be between the orange flag on the Race Committee boat and the nearby mark of the course.

Time Limit: The time limit shall be 2 1/2 hours from the time of the class start. Yachts failing to finish within 60 minutes of the finishing time of the first yacht to finish in their class will be scored 2 points more than the last yacht to finish in their class.

Retirement: A yacht that retires shall notify the Race Committee before leaving the racing area. If that is not possible, the yacht shall notify NCYC as soon as possible. The club monitors VHF channel 16. Club telephone: (734) 242-5081.

Alternative Penalty: Racing Rule 44 as stated in the 2009-2012 Racing Rules applies.

Safety: All yachts shall follow the U.S. Coast Guard requirements for carrying safety equipment and for using lights at night.

NCYC accepts no liability for yachts or crew participating in these events. It shall be the sole and inescapable responsibility of the skipper and crew of the individual yachts to decide whether or not to start, continue, or finish a race. Further, each skipper is solely responsible for the personal safety of themselves, their crew and their yacht.

Protest: A yacht shall notify the race committee at the finishing line of her intent to protest and the sail number of the protested yacht.

Protests shall be written on US Sailing Association forms (available at NCYC) and must be presented to a member of the Race Committee at the NCYC clubhouse within one hour after the time of the last yacht's finishing time."

Radio Communications: VHF Channel **71** shall be used for all radio communications.

When on the water, the Race Committee is not obligated to answer individual questions regarding the conduct of the races but will attempt to provide useful information as they are able to do so.
