

Discipline Policy

In order to ensure all children are offered the same learning opportunities in a safe environment, we must institute and enforce a strict discipline policy for each of our classes. Remembering that Sail Camp is an on the water activity and safety is our number one concern.

If a child is disrupting the class and will not take direction from the instructor, they will first receive a warning. If the behavior continues, the child will be removed from the class and placed with the parent of the day for the remainder of that day's class. The child will not be allowed to return to class until a conference can be held with the child's parents(s), the camp director, the instructors involved with the incidence and the child, if the parent so desires. At this conference the behavior and safety concerns will be discussed and options explored to correct the problem. After the conference, if the behavior reoccurs the child will be removed from sail camp for the remainder of the class.

It is not the intent of the sail camp and Junior Sailing Committee to expel children but to make a safe and fun place to learn sailing for all of our children.

In an effort to prevent problems the Junior Sailing Committee would like the parents and child to read and sign this letter of understanding. Please sign and bring to the first day of camp.
